## **Criminology Units – 36 points**

Criminology Course Core Required Units (9 points) – must take CRM201, CRM303 and CRM307.

Crime Science major# - Students must complete 24 points:

CRM100, CRM120, CRM203, CRM207, CRM301, CHE103, BMS213, BIO388. All units specified must be completed. Criminology Specified Electives – Students must take 3 points of Specified Electives (see list in handbook under course code B1345).

Co-Major in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices (CJ-IKP) - 18 points

Students who elect to complete the co-major will need to use 18 points from the available 27 points of option / electives. SIK102, SIK200, SIK201, SIK300, SIK301, COD301

## Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices (MN-IKP) – 12 points

If students wish to complete a minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices (instead of the co-major), students must select SIK102 Wandju Boodja (Welcome to Country) and complete SIK200, SIK201 <u>and</u> SIK300 or COD301.

## Notes:

- Do not exceed 10 units at level 100 (first year).
- The remaining 27 points can be comprised of a second major, co-major, minors or general electives refer to handbook.
- Check the university timetable each year to confirm the teaching period units run as they are subject to change.
