## **Criminology Units:**

Students should contact the Criminology Academic Chair ([crim.academicchair@murdoch.edu.au](mailto:crim.academicchair@murdoch.edu.au)) for advice mapping out their Criminology Major units; this plan may need to be rearranged.

**Criminology Core Units<sup>^</sup>** – must take CRM303, CRM307, and two **Criminology Specified Electives<sup>AA</sup>** – see the Handbook for list of major units and core electives. CRM303 has replaced CRM306. If you have completed CRM306, you do not need to complete CRM303.

**Crime Science Major (pre-2025 commencement)** – CRM100, CRM120, CRM201, CRM203, CRM301, CHE103, BMS213, BIO388

## **Core Law Units**

**Law Specified Electives<sup>+</sup>** - Students must complete 21 points of during their studies. Some Law Specified Electives are 6 points. These electives are also offered in non-standard teaching periods (such as summer, winter, and trimester teaching periods) and students may undertake them in those periods instead of during semester.

Note: Students considering applying for LLB Honours should contact the Honours Chair at the end of their third year.
