**Murdoch Spine Specified Electives: Career learning Units

Students must complete MSP100, and two additional career spine unit. There are a range of units that can be used to fulfil that requirement including many LLB units. You can swap the enrolment *order* of LLB specified electives and career spine units if you wish. Refer to the University Handbook published in the academic year you intend to complete them.

Unit changes

- BJU100 and LLB120 have been discontinued from 2025 and replaced by LLB100 Foundations of Law. Students commencing in 2024 or earlier should have already completed BJU100 and LLB120. If you have not completed both BJU100 and LLB120, please contact the Academic Chair for advice on unit enrolment in S1 2025.
- BJU200 Skills for Legal Practice is now known as LLB200 Skills for Legal Practice.
- BJU300 Legal Theory and Research is now known as LLB350 Legal Theory and Research.

Global Security Units:

Students should contact the Global Security Academic Chair for advice mapping out their Global Security units; this plan may need to be rearranged.

- Global Security Major* consists of 24 points in total (see handbook)
- Global Security Electives^ – must complete 12 points of GS electives (see handbook)

LLB/BGS special program requirements (2024 commencing students and earlier):

Students must complete 60 points of Law required (core) units; this includes the standard 54 points AND two additional required units (LLB201 and LLB365).

** LLB201 and LLB365 are usually noted as Law Specified Electives in the Handbook; they are required core units in this combined degree.

+ Students must complete 15 points of Law Specified Electives during their studies. Some Law Specified Electives are 6 points.

Law Specified Electives are also offered in non-standard teaching periods (such as summer, winter, and trimester teaching periods) and students may undertake Law Specified Electives in those periods instead of during semester.

Students considering applying for Honours should contact the Honours Chair at the end of their third year.

Advanced standing:

If you have been granted advanced standing, please confirm with the Academic Chair how the advanced standing is allocated in your course structure.
