**Murdoch Discovery Study and General Electives

Students must complete one unit of Discovery Study (3 points). This unit must be outside of the School of Law and Criminology and School of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences. Students must also complete 6 points worth of general electives (non-LLB coded units). There are a range of units that can be used to fulfil that requirement. Refer to the University Handbook published in the academic year you intend to complete.

Global Security Units:

Students should contact the Global Security Academic Chair for advice mapping out their Global Security units; this plan may need to be rearranged.

- Global Security Major* consists of 24 points in total (see handbook)
- Global Security Electives^ – must complete 12 points of GS electives (see handbook)

Law specified electives:

+ Students must complete 21 points of Law Specified Electives during their studies. Some Law Specified Electives are 6 points.
