****Discovery Study and General Electives**

Students must complete 3 points of Discovery Study. The Discovery Unit must be outside of the School of Law and Criminology. Students must also complete 15 points of General Electives during their studies (non-LLB coded units). There are a range of units that can be used to fulfil that requirement. Refer to the University Handbook published in the academic year you intend to complete them.

+Law Specified Electives:

Students must complete 24 points of Law Specified Electives during their studies. Some Law Specified Electives are 6 points. Law Specified Electives are also offered in non-standard teaching periods (such as summer, winter, and trimester teaching periods) and students may undertake Law Specified Electives in those periods instead of during semester.

Students wishing to complete Honours should seek advice from the Honours Academic Chair at the end of Year 2; the Honours program will affect the number of specified electives required to be completed.

Minor in Technology and Law (MN-TL) – 12 points

Students who elect to complete the minor will need to use 12 points from the available 24 points of law specified electives.

- LLB326 – Cybercrime and Digital Forensics - (6 points)
- LLB330 – Law Reform and Access to Justice (clinic unit) - (3 points)
- LLB343 – Reimaging Law: Technology and the Future of Law - (3 points)

Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices in Law (MN-IKPL) – 12 points

If students wish to complete a minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices in Law, students must select SIK102, SIK202, LLB203 and either LLB305 or LLB333. If you plan to complete LLB333, 3 points (of the 6 points) will cover another law elective.

Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices (MN-IKP) – 12 points

If students wish to complete a minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices, students must select SIK102, SIK200, SIK201 and SIK300 or COD301. The minor is in place of the 12 points from the allocated 15 points in *general electives*.

****Recommended General Electives (15 points):**

Choose from any unit in the University where pre-requisite requirements are met. If you are enrolled to complete the **Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices**, you take only one general elective. If you are enrolled in the **Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices in Law**, you can take up to 9 points of general electives (SIK102, SIK202 will be 6 points of general electives).
