## Course: C1111 – Graduate Certificate in Counselling

Credit points: 12 Academic Chair: Dr Ben Mullings (<u>ben.mullings@murdoch.edu.au</u>)

The **Graduate Certificate in Counselling** is a short course which can be completed within one semester full-time or spaced out across several semesters part-time. This course is suitable for students who wish to learn more about counselling or to supplement their training in other fields (such as psychology, teaching, or community development) with some applied counselling skills. The Graduate Certificate in Counselling comprises half of the units and credit points required to complete the Graduate Diploma in Counselling. Students who successfully complete this course may enrol in the Graduate Diploma of Counselling to progress their training further.

Students enrolled in the Graduate Certificate in Counselling must enrol in CSL582 Principles of Counselling 1 as the foundational unit (6 credit points). In addition, they enrol in two other units worth 3 credit points each, including:

- CSL566 Case Conceptualisation and Assessment in Counselling
- CSL581 Experiential Learning in Group Counselling (S1 only)
- CSL578 Counselling Children and Adolescents (S2 only)
- CSL583 Counselling Adults (S2 only)
