### Course: C1111 – Graduate Certificate in Counselling

Credit points: 12

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The **Graduate Certificate in Counselling** is a short course which can be completed within one semester full-time (semester 1 start only) or spaced out across several semesters part-time. This course is suitable for students who wish to learn more about counselling or to supplement their training in other fields (such as psychology, teaching, or community development) with some applied counselling skills. The Graduate Certificate in Counselling comprises half of the units and credit points required to complete the Graduate Diploma in Counselling. Students who successfully complete this course may enrol in the Graduate Diploma of Counselling to progress their training further.

Students enrolled in the Graduate Certificate in Counselling must enrol in these two core units worth 3 credit points each:

- CSL505 Professional Counselling Skills (3cp)
- CSL504 Counselling Theories and Practice (3cp)

In addition, they need to enrol in two other specified electives worth 3 credit points each from the following electives:

- CSL501 Counselling Across the Lifespan (3cp)
- CSL566 Case Conceptualisation and Assessment in Counselling (3cp)
- CSL581 Experiential Learning in Group Counselling (3cp)
- CSL500 Counselling Indigenous, Multicultural and Diverse Populations (3cp)
- CSL502 Mental Health Counselling (3cp)
