Entry Requirements (Onshore)

Advanced academic study, research preparation and professional experience are required for admission to the course. To be eligible for admission as a candidate for a Doctor of Education an applicant must have: Bachelor Degree with at least a 2A Honours normally in the same discipline (AQF level 8); or a Master's Degree normally in the same discipline (AQF level 9) and satisfy the Graduate Research Manager with evidence of substantive and significant scholarly or professional attainments; or a Bachelor Degree normally in the same discipline (AQF level 7) and satisfy the Graduate Research Manager with evidence of substantive and significant scholarly or professional attainments including satisfactory research preparation the equivalent of AQF level 8 or 9. Students who have a Master of Education degree by coursework or research will be considered on a case-by-case basis for credit.

English Language Requirements

Equivalent of an Academic IELTS overall score of 6.5 with no band less than 6.0.

Additional Progression Requirements

In order to progress to the dissertation component of this degree students must achieve a minimum of 65 percent across all units, a minimum of 65 percent in Research Methodology units and pass the exam or permission of the Academic Chair.

Full-time Study is 12 credit points per semester

Part-time Study is 6 credit points per semester
