The **Master of Counselling** is a 48-credit point course which can be completed within 2 years of full-time study or part-time across 3-4 years. This course is suitable for students who wish to attain qualifications for entry to the profession of counselling recognised by both the Australian Counselling Association (ACA) and PACFA. Entry to the Master of Counselling requires successful completion of the Graduate Diploma in Counselling. Applicants must provide an up to date CV and a brief written statement of up to 750 words (available online at <https://mu-publishing-blob.azureedge.net/mu-publishing/mu-docs/librariesprovider4/default-document-library/personal-statement-template.pdf>). Our selection panel then interviews applicants to assess their suitability and readiness to commence with our training. Places in the Master of Counselling are limited.

Our recommended course plan comprises all units from the Graduate Diploma in Counselling in Year 1. Commencing the Master of Counselling from mid-year is not recommended as it limits training options for the student within a 1+1 training framework. That is, students commencing the Master of Counselling from mid-year are required to enrol in CSL620 Counselling Research Project if they wish to complete the course within 2 years. Given that this is a 9 credit point unit spanning 12 months, the student will not have the optional elective to enrol in CSL674 Trauma Counselling. Students commencing the Master of Counselling from mid-year should understand the CSL620 is a solo research project intended to demonstrate their capacity to carry out independent research, required to apply for PhD studies.

Mid-Year Intake (**not recommended** as pre-requisites must be waived for CSL566 and CSL576)

NOTE: The structure of the Mid-Year Intake model is for international students only. All domestic students must successfully complete CSL582 as a pre-requisite for enrolment to CSL576. The decision to waive pre-requisites is not automatic and is at the discretion of the Academic Chair.

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Other variations to the above course plans are possible. Students need to be aware of the following parameters:

- CSL684 Principles of Counselling 2 is offered in S2 only and CSL679 is a pre-requisite for this unit.
- CSL674 Trauma Counselling is offered in S1 only. This is an elective unit only available if enrolled in CSL677.
- CSL677 Counselling Research Project is a year-long group research project commencing from S1 to S2 only.
- CSL620 Counselling Research Project is a year-long solo research project which may be commenced in S2.
