**Please note:**

*The outline provided above is for full-time enrolment starting S2 of 2020.* Should you be undertaking part-time enrolment your units will be spread across multiple years in discussion with the Academic Chair.

VET654 is available as 3, 6 and 9 point options, and is repeatable (so you may undertake multiple enrolments in this unit). The 6 and 9 point offerings can be taken in one semester (S1 or S2), across the year (Y mode), or across two years (S2 of one year, S1 of the next, H-mode). The unit is generally placement based, although may be a desk-based report in some circumstances.

**COVID-19 ADJUSTMENTS TO UNIT OFFERINGS**

**VET606 – Wildlife Epidemiology and Disease Risk Analysis**

This unit will not be offered in S2 of 2020. Students wishing to undertake it in S2 will need to enrol in VET656 Public Health and Epidemiology, and should contact the Academic Chair for further guidance, as VET656 is offered in two teaching periods (S2 and T3), as well as an online only and internal version. VET606 will resume in S2 of 2021.

**VET654 – Wildlife Health and Conservation Project**

Owing to the University ban on travel until December 2020, the placement option for VET654 will not be available for S2 of 2020. Students wishing to undertake this unit are advised to contact the unit coordinator or the Academic Chair to discuss either desk-based projects, or other enrolment options.

**VET6531 – Wildlife Health and Conservation Research Dissertation**

Students wishing to undertake this unit must make contact with the Academic Chair to discuss eligibility, as the impact on laboratory access and fieldwork/travel may make this unsuitable for a S2 enrolment.
