

EFFECTIVE FROM 01 JANUARY 2026

Purpose and Scope

This policy states the University principles for the admission and enrolment of Coursework students, including recognition of prior learning. The policy does not cover Short Courses.

This policy applies to all staff, current and prospective students.

See the [Graduate Research Degrees Regulations](#) for admission and enrolment to higher degree research courses.

Policy

1. In this policy, the following words have the following meanings:
 - 1.1. “Award” is defined in the [Coursework Regulations](#).
 - 1.2. “Course” is explained in the [Coursework Regulations](#).
 - 1.3. “Coursework” is explained in the [Coursework Regulations](#).
 - 1.4. “International Student Visa Holder” means a person who holds a student visa and is defined as an overseas student in the [Education Services for Overseas Students Act 2000](#).
 - 1.5. “Nominated Guardian” means a parent, legal custodian or relative (as defined by the Department of Home Affairs) who:
 - 1.5.1 is at least 21 years old
 - 1.5.2 has permission to live in Australia for the duration of the Course or until the International Student Visa Holder is 18 years old
 - 1.5.3 is of good character
 - 1.5.4 provides care and support for the student.
2. Admission and enrolment will:
 - 2.1. meet regulatory requirements

- 2.2. preserve Award integrity
- 2.3. be fair, consistent and transparent
- 2.4. be based on the principles of equity and inclusion
- 2.5. provide opportunities for First Nations students and students from underrepresented backgrounds
- 2.6. support student progression and timely Course completion
- 2.7. support mobility between institutions and levels of the *Australian Qualifications Framework* (AQF)
- 2.8. ensure that students have the academic preparation needed to participate in their study:
 - 2.8.1 with a minimum Australian Tertiary Admission Rank of 70 or equivalent for admission to AQF Level 7 Courses
- 2.9. ensure that students have the proficiency in English needed to participate in their study:
 - 2.9.1 with a minimum International English Language Testing System score of 6.0 or equivalent for admission to AQF Level 7 Courses or higher.
- 3. Admission and enrolment processes will ensure that:
 - 3.1. prospective and current students are provided with accurate and relevant information and advice in a timely manner
 - 3.2. offers of admission are made in writing and include any conditions of enrolment or participation
 - 3.3. students and Nominated Guardians are informed of their rights and responsibilities prior to enrolment and before fees are accepted
 - 3.4. students have given permission before they are enrolled in a unit
 - 3.5. students complete at least one third of the total credit point value of their enrolled Award Course at Murdoch.
- 4. Current and prospective students are responsible for providing complete and accurate information relevant to their admission and enrolment within the specified timeframes.
