

Purpose and Scope

To establish the principles for governing and managing University Legislation and Policy Documents.

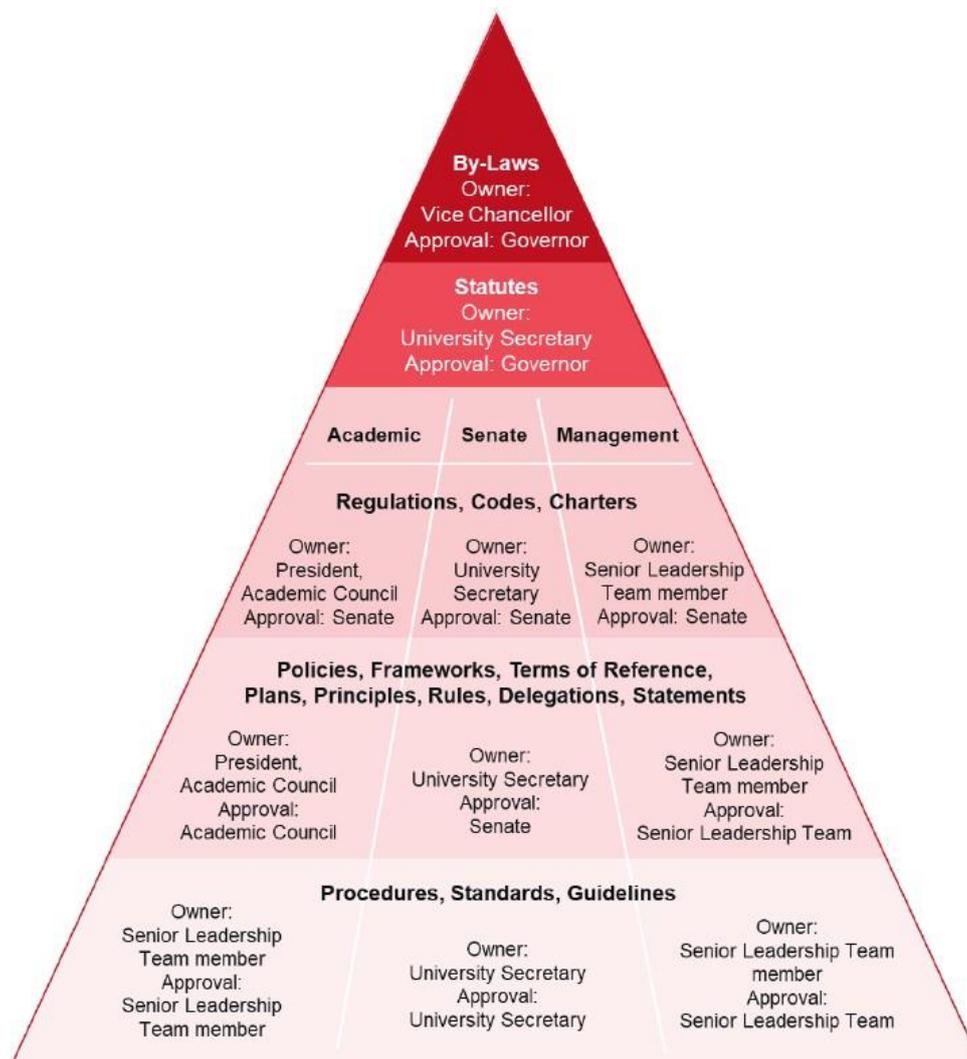
This policy applies to all members of the University community.

Policy

1. In this policy, the following words have the following meanings:
 - 1.1. An “Act” is a formal law or decision made by a Federal or State legislature.
 - 1.2. A “Code” is statement of mandatory requirements guiding the behaviour of the University’s community.
 - 1.3. A “By-Law” is delegated legislation established under the Murdoch University Act 1973 which regulates the University. By-Laws pertain to the use of university lands and buildings and provide for penalties for breaches.
 - 1.4. A “Policy” is a statement of mandatory principles guiding the University’s operations and significant decision making.
 - 1.5. “Policy Documents” are Codes, charters, Policies, frameworks, terms of reference, plans, principles, statements, Procedures, standards, and guidelines.
 - 1.6. A “Procedure” is a statement of the University’s mandatory processes and responsibilities which give effect to a Policy.
 - 1.7. A “Regulation” is a delegated legislation established under the Murdoch University Act 1973 and is designed to control or govern procedure or conduct.
 - 1.8. A “Rule” is delegated legislation established under the Murdoch University Act 1973 governing a particular matter.
 - 1.9. A “Statute” is established under the Murdoch University Act 1973. It is a law or directive, or mandate intended to be or a permanent or long-lasting that governs the internal affairs of the University and prescribes the University’s structure, procedure, or practice.

- 1.10. "University Legislation" means the Murdoch University Act 1973 and University By-Laws, Statutes, Regulations and Rules.
2. Regulations, Rules, and Policy Documents
 - 2.1. exist only when there is a justifiable need
 - 2.2. are consistent with legal and regulatory requirements, University Legislation, Policy Documents and delegations and authorisations
 - 2.3. align with the University Strategy
 - 2.4. are developed and reviewed in consultation with stakeholders
 - 2.5. meet the requirements of the University's policy style guide and templates
 - 2.6. are able to be implemented within university resources
 - 2.7. apply across the University community unless otherwise stated.
3. Normally only Regulations, Policies, Codes and Procedures may be developed.
4. Regulations exist only where required by Statute.
5. By-Laws, Statutes, Regulations, Rules and Policy Documents are reviewed at least every three years.
6. A Regulation, Rule, or Policy Document remains valid until it is revised or rescinded, even if it has not been reviewed within its review date.

7. Approval authorities, owners and hierarchy are normally classified as follows:



8. All members of the University community must:
- 8.1. comply with relevant University Legislation and Policy Documents
 - 8.2. inform themselves about and keep up to date with relevant University Legislation and Policy Documents.
