***Social Media and Contemporary Ainu Identities:
Exploring the role of YouTube in Ainu cultural resurgence***

This thesis explores Ainu-identifying content creators' use of YouTube for Indigenous cultural resurgence. Despite evidence of Ainu activity on YouTube and other social media, in-depth qualitative research on the topic was scarce. Through ethnographic fieldwork and interviews, I found that while YouTube has capacity to facilitate and grow Ainu everyday popular culture, it also risks reinforcing existing colonial constructions of Ainu identity. This work contributes to a greater understanding of Indigenous experiences online.

The goal is to contribute fresh knowledge to the academic, philosophical, and art communities by interpreting this body of scholarship. By applying these theories to a body of creative work focused on local sites in East Victoria Park, WA, the aim is to interrogate the relationship between theory and practice. In connecting habitus, phenomenological reflection, and the power of both materiality and affect through painting and drawing, my practice tests, complicates and extends these concepts.

Beyond the Mine Site: Social Reproduction and Gender Equality in an Extractives Town

This thesis examines how mining shapes everyday life for women in Karratha, Western Australia. Using interviews with fourteen women, it shows that mining companies use housing to control access to jobs, stability and services. Despite full-time work, women carry most unpaid care. Housing also affects healthcare, education and leisure. Sexism, racism and environmental harm are often ignored, deepening inequality and shaping power in the town.

An Examination of Governance Factors Affecting Small Not-For-Profit Sustainability

The thesis examined how governance practices affect the financial and human resource sustainability of small not-for-profit organisations. Through an investigation of three Western Australian organisations, the study found that increasing complexity and compliance demands placed pressure on already-limited governance capacity. When governance systems cannot maintain pace, leader wellbeing and access to funds are put at risk, destabilising an increasingly fragile sector. The study deepens the understanding of how contemporary governance theories both enable and constrain the long-term sustainability of small NFPs.

"Yet We Do Always Find Ourselves in Places":

Towards a Critical Reading Practice for Literary Implacement

The thesis develops an original framework for literary implacement to demonstrate how character in narrative fiction is imaginatively shaped by and derives a sense of self from their surroundings. Adapting philosopher Edward S. Casey's concept of implacement, the thesis deploys the critical reading and interpretive practice of literary implacement, highlighting the interdependence of character and place in selected novels and underscoring the significance of this dynamic in the real world.

An Unruly Business: Character in the realist short story

For many writers, character creation is central to stories, as seen in my short stories. The thesis examines the construction of fictional characters from both formalist and humanist perspectives. It claims that writers' creative processes can be enhanced by literary models and explores Jens Eder's the Clock of Character from film theory as a tool for literary analysis and character creation. The combination of creative work and theoretical analysis reflects a practice-based research methodology.

"Finding yourself and losing yourself": The textured narratives of humanitarian practitioners

The thesis brings to life the often-hidden narratives of humanitarian practitioners, giving expression to experiences for which it is not always easy to find words, and illuminating a series of co-existent and sometimes contradictory realities they encounter in the theatres of their work. Narrative practice is modelled as a valuable method for coming to terms with these entanglements and intractable challenges: for current and future practitioners, and for educators and leaders who prepare others for such work.

Dr Vivienne Hansen

Vivienne Hansen is a Practitioner of Noongar Medicine, author and renowned speaker.

She has dedicated her life to sharing, teaching, and advocating for Noongar culture, language and knowledge.

A Balladong Wadjuk Yorga woman from the Bibbulmun Nation, or Noongar people, of the south-west of Western Australia, Vivienne spent her early years learning from family members about traditional medicine.

Their teachings instilled in Vivienne a passion for bush medicine and healing, as well as for sharing and preserving Noongar culture.

Vivienne later undertook further training at the Marr Moorditj Foundation where she completed Certificate IV in Bush and Western Herbal Medicine and was the first Indigenous member of the National Herbalist Association of Australia.

She is the co-author of two books, *Noongar Bush Medicine* and *Noongar Bush Tucker*, which are intended as both practical guides and historical records.

Following in the footsteps of her grandfather and great-grandfather, who were both healers, Vivienne is a leader in the field of bush medicine and recognised for her ongoing efforts to preserve Indigenous knowledge for future generations.
